**Rep. D'Amelio: House OK's Waterbury Resident's Appointment as
Workers' Compensation Commissioner**



***Former DPUC Commissioner Jack Goldberg of Waterbury
Confirmed Unanimously***

The state House of Representatives has confirmed Waterbury resident Jack Goldberg's nomination to be a Workers' Compensation Commissioner, state

Representative Anthony J. D'Amelio said today.

Mr. Goldberg, an attorney who served for several years as a state Department of Public Utility Control commissioner, was confirmed by the House on a unanimous vote Wednesday, said Representative D'Amelio, R-71st District, who supported Mr. Goldberg's nomination in remarks on the floor of the House.

"Jack Goldberg is a thoughtful, compassionate person who was an effective, fair-minded DPUC commissioner for several years," Representative D'Amelio said. "Those qualities will serve him well as a Workers Compensation Commissioner, where he will be adjudicating claims for work-related injuries."

"Jack is one of my constituents and I have known him for many years," Representative D'Amelio said. "As an attorney he has the ability to look at both sides of an issue and arrive at a decision that is fair and reasonable. Connecticut will be very well-served with Jack Goldberg as a Workers' Compensation Commissioner."

In addition to serving as a DPUC commissioner, Mr. Goldberg formerly worked for the House Republican Office and was a reporter for the Republican American, Representative D'Amelio said.
